**ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM**

The IHSAA is philosophically opposed to all-tournament team selections. If the media wishes to conduct a poll, that is no concern of ours, but we do not want to condone it by announcing it at the tournament.

**AWARDS**

Trophies will be awarded to first, second, third and consolation winners. Medals will be awarded to members of the champion and runner-up teams. Presentation of championship and runner-up awards will be made at the conclusion of the tournament. During the awards ceremony, the runner-up trophy will be presented, followed by an introduction of the coach, who in turn will introduce each of the players as the awarder presents them with a medal. The championship trophy will be presented in the same manner as the runner-up. Consolation and third place trophies will be awarded immediately following the consolation and third place games.

**CROWD CONTROL**

The IHSAA wishes to continue close supervision of crowds at the state basketball tournaments and asks for the continued support and cooperation of administrators in enforcing crowd control and the following rules:

1. No one other than authorized individuals will be allowed on the floor area.
2. Persons who jump the railing or other barriers to enter the floor area will be removed from the premises for the remainder of the tournament.

### **Tournament Admission Policy**

Coaches participating in the tournament will gain admission with a tournament pass issued from the IHSAA office. It should be emphasized that the participating coach's IHSAA activity card number will be credited as having only ONE ADMISSION ELIGIBLE for each session. (Only one person will be admitted on the participating coach's IHSAA activity card if the coach has been issued a tournament pass.) All other IHSAA card holders will be allowed one guest. Statisticians and bus drivers will need to purchase tickets.

### **Security at The Idaho Center**

The Idaho High School Activities Association is committed to providing safe and meaningful state championship events, free from any potential dangers. To ensure a safe environment at the Idaho Center, the following security measures will be strictly enforced for every person entering the building. This includes all players, coaches, managers, administrators, cheerleaders, bands, performing groups, and tournament helpers for girls' and boy's basketball.

- All competitors, support personnel, coaches and tournament personnel will be admitted to the state basketball tournaments through entrance #6.
- Every bag will be searched by Idaho Center security upon entering the building. Any type of explosive material, items that could be used as weapons (knives, glass containers, etc.) or objects that could be thrown onto the playing area will be confiscated.
- General spectators, including fans, parents and student support groups, will not be permitted to bring food, beverages, food containers or glass bottles of any type into the building.

Please review the above stipulations and entry procedures with your coaches, participants, fans and support groups so as to eliminate any problems and unnecessary delays that could happen upon entry into the Idaho Center.

### **State Basketball Financial Plan**

The State Basketball Financial Plan has two very positive features:

1. Schools will receive some expense money.
2. Money will be sent to the schools soon after the completion of basketball tournaments.

Financial reimbursement is based upon mileage and number of games played. The one-way mileage will be determined from participating school to tournament site. If the school plays only two games in the state tournament, the mileage figure will be multiplied by two. If they play three games, it will be multiplied by three.

The money available for disbursement will be divided by the sum of mileage multiples for all schools as described above. The quotient will then be multiplied by each individual school's mileage multiple to determine the dollar figure for the school.

It is important to point out that due to our sponsorship agreement with the United Dairymen of Idaho, our association will be able to return more money to our schools than before 1984.

Twenty-five thousand dollars from the Dairymen's sponsorship has been earmarked for return to schools participating in girls' or boys' state basketball tournaments. This will be returned following the completion of all state basketball tournaments.

Example: Bonneville qualifies for the 5A state tournament in Boise. They travel 284 miles to Boise and play 3 games.  $284 \times 3 = 852$  mileage multiple for Bonneville. This is done for all 48 girls' teams and all 48 boys' teams, adding all the mileage multiples together. The money available is divided for disbursement by the sum of all the mileage multiples, then multiply the quotient by 852 to determine the amount of money Bonneville school will receive. This money is sent following the basketball tournaments.

### **JERSEYS**

Bring two sets of jerseys and your practice basketballs. The first day of the tournament, the team in the top bracket shall be the "home" team. The home teams will wear light jerseys and sit on the right side of the official's table (as you face it). The second day of the tournament, the tournament manager shall assign "home team" status.

### **LOST AND FOUND**

A lost and found will be established by the tournament manager.

## **MEDIA INFORMATION**

**Broadcasts** - Any station wishing to broadcast a state tournament game must sign and meet the requirements of the IHSAA broadcast contract. No more than two broadcast teams per game will be allowed.

**Media Credentials** - Media passes will be issued to members of the media upon request to the IHSAA or the tournament manager.

**TV Rights** - No contest may be filmed or videotaped without the expressed written consent of the IHSAA.

## **MOTEL CONDUCT**

Each year a few athletes create a bad image for the rest by their uncontrolled behavior in motels. Coaches are encouraged to check rooms closely upon arrival and at departure. Please make sure athletes are properly supervised.

## **NATIONAL ANTHEM**

The National Anthem will be played at the beginning of each session. The introduction of players will begin five minutes prior to the scheduled starting time and will be immediately followed by the National Anthem.

## **NETS**

Due to the potential for serious injury, teams will not be allowed to cut down the nets. A net will be awarded to the championship team. We are asking for each school's cooperation on this matter.

## **NUMBER OF PLAYERS**

Each school represented at the tournament may suit 15 players. Passes will be provided for 15 players, two managers, and one assistant coach. If more than 15 players are in uniform at the start of competition, the game shall be forfeited.

## **OFFICIAL BASKETBALL**

An official NFHS approved regulation basketball will be provided by the tournament manager.

## **OFFICIAL RULES**

National Federation rules will be used for all Idaho basketball games.

## **PAIRINGS, BRACKETS & TIMES**

Eight-team single elimination, with a consolation bracket for first-round losers and play-off for third and fifth place (5A, 4A, 3A and 2A). The 1A tournament will be a sixteen team single elimination, with a consolation bracket for first-time losers.

## **PARTICIPATING SCHOOL'S RESPONSIBILITY**

Crowd control, safety, and good sportsmanship are major concerns, and we appreciate administrators' cooperation in these areas. Please consider holding a pre-tournament assembly to impress on your young people that they represent many people.

Cheerleaders should be instructed to coordinate their cheers with the cheering section and to stay off the court while the game is in progress. Students should be instructed not to run onto the floor after the basketball games. **Climbing railings, throwing objects onto the floor, confetti and artificial noisemakers such as bells, whistles, air horns, megaphones and balloons are prohibited.** Each school is responsible for the conduct of its students, and with your help we can insure that all teams play in a fair, sportsmanlike atmosphere.

## **PEP BANDS, PEP CLUBS, CHEERLEADERS, MARCHING GROUPS**

**Seating** - Pep bands and pep clubs must use the assigned area.

**Pep Bands** - Forty-five (45) pep band members will be admitted free. The school will be billed later for the difference. A band director or school official must be present at the time the band is admitted and should sign the form at the gate for admission of additional pep band members. Pep bands may play only during games in which their team participates. Pep bands may play before the game, at time outs, quarters, and at halftimes, but

## **PLAYING DURING A LIVE BALL IS PROHIBITED.**

Each pep band will be responsible for its own instruments. There are no special facilities for storing instruments at the tournament sites. Please bring instruments only to the game in which your team participates. Drums and other instruments are to be used only when the entire pep band plays.

**Pep Club** - All students must present their activity cards to be admitted for the student price. A special seating area will be reserved for the pep club.

**Cheerleaders** - Fifteen cheerleaders in uniform from each school will be admitted free. Schools may bring more than fifteen cheerleaders, but will be billed for the excess. The tournament manager will assign the cheerleaders to a specific area where team cheers must be conducted.

**Drill Teams** - Drill team members are admitted free of charge to sessions during which they will perform. They must present activity cards to be admitted for the student price at other sessions.

**Halftime Activities** - Drill teams or other official school organizations desiring to present entertainment at halftime should make direct arrangements with the tournament director. Any halftime performance is limited to seven minutes total time. In the past we have had problems with drill teams exceeding the time limitation. Any drill team that exceeds the time limitation will not be allowed to perform in further sessions.

### ROSTERS AND TEAM PICTURES

Girls' rosters and scores of regular season games should be submitted by the end of the day on February 7; boy's rosters and scores of regular season games by February 21. All rosters and game scores are to be submitted via the on-line form on the website, [idhsaa.org](http://idhsaa.org). Pictures are also due by the same time and may be sent as JPEG or TIFF attachments to [cherylm@idhsaa.org](mailto:cherylm@idhsaa.org) or original photos mailed to 8011 Ustick Road, Boise 83704. Rosters and/or pictures not received by the deadline may not appear in the tournament program. Please call the IHSAA if you have any questions about picture formats. When e-mailed pictures are received, you will receive a reply that the picture has been received. If you do not get a reply, the picture did not go through.

### SIGNS

Signs and banners will be limited to the area in front of each school's assigned cheering section. Schools should check with the tournament manager prior to hanging any signs at the state tournament site. Please do not tape signs to painted surfaces.



## **SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD**

The State Basketball Tournaments will feature a sportsmanship award to be presented to the schools exhibiting the best sportsmanship at the State Basketball Tournaments in all five divisions for both boys and girls. The schools will be judged in the following areas:

### **Cheerleaders**

1. Personal appearance and conduct
2. Respect for the Flag, National Anthem, and opponents
3. Appropriate choice and timing of cheers, chants and yells, as well as courtesy toward opponents and officials - plus crowd control before, during and following the game.

### **Cheering Section (Pep Club, Student Body, Adult fans)**

1. Respect for the Flag, National Anthem, opponents and officials
2. Courtesy toward opponents and tournament manager before, during and after the game
3. Complete observance of tournament regulations (signs, noisemakers, debris, etc.). Chants or distractions during opponent's free throws or introduction of opponents will result in a loss of rating points.

### **Team and Coach**

1. Respect for the Flag, National Anthem, opponents and officials.
2. Attitude displayed by players, coaches and bench throughout the game.

### **Unacceptable Behavior**

1. Banners that are personal, negative, unsportsmanlike or vulgar.
2. Throwing objects onto the playing area, chanting and creating distractions during free throws.
3. Booing, chanting "air ball", "You! You! You!", or any other derogatory phrase directed toward an opponent or official.
4. Rowdiness, face painting and shabby attire.
5. Taunting, baiting and displays of unacceptable conduct toward players, coaches, security, and cheering sections.

## **T SHIRTS**

T-shirts will be sold at the tournament sites by McU Sports.

## **TOWELS**

Dressing rooms will be assigned daily by the tournament manager. Towels will not be provided. Managers of teams are responsible to pick up litter from the floor of the locker room. Facilities are not available for uniform drying and storage.

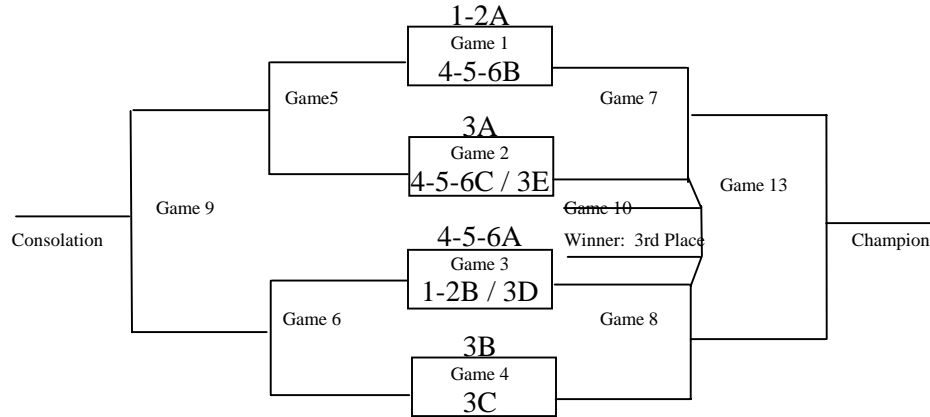
## **TRAINING ROOM**

Fifteen (15) minutes will usually be allowed for warm-up between games, but may be limited to ten (10) minutes because of schedule requirements.

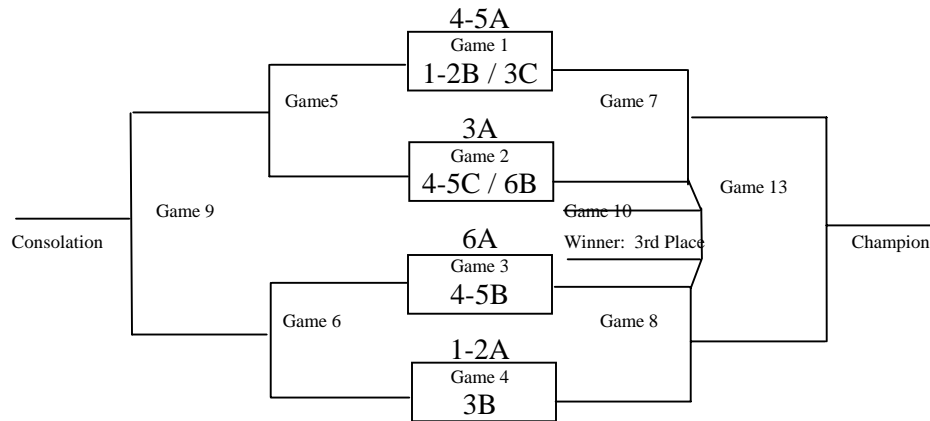

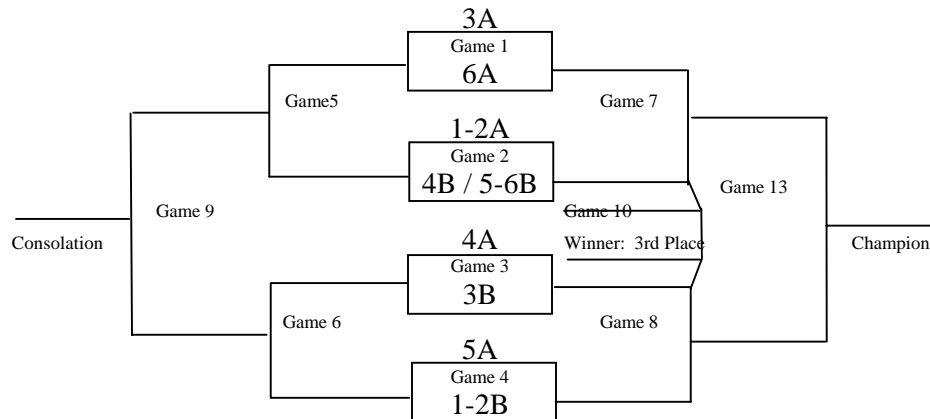
5A Girls: Games 9 & 10 will be played at Skyview High School

5A Boys: Games 9 & 10 will be played at Vallivue High School

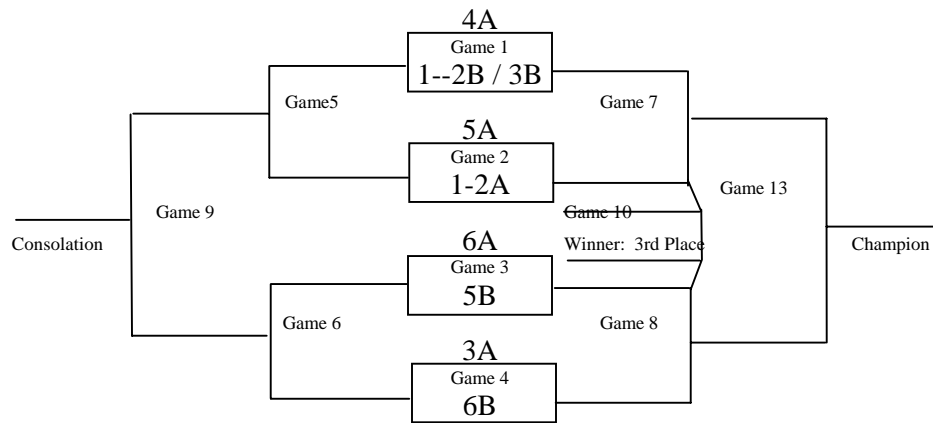
## 4A GIRLS & BOYS



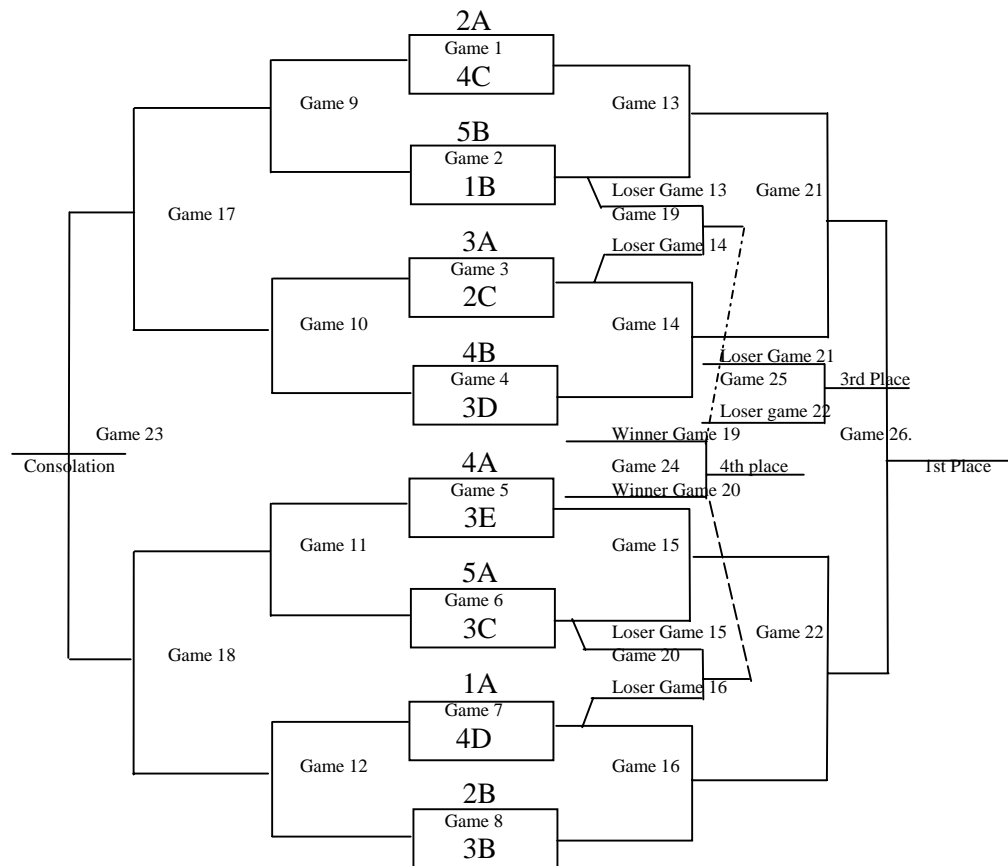
## 3A GIRLS & BOYS
