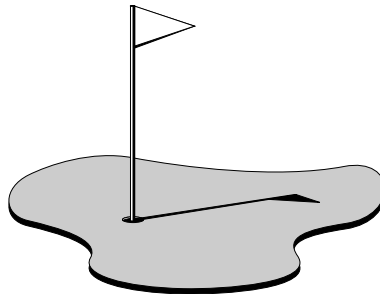

SCHEDULE

First Day

All teams will play 18 holes. Medalist honors will be determined from first-round scores.

Second Day

The four teams in each classification with the lowest first round scores will play 18 holes for the championship. Any team within ten (10) strokes of the 3rd place team will also be allowed to play for the championship.

CLASSIFICATION

5A:	1280 and over in grades 9-12
4A:	1279 - 640 in grades 9-12
3A:	639 - 320 in grades 9-12
2A:	319 and under in grades 9-12

REPRESENTATION — Boys & Girls

Representation from district to state is based on the number of complete teams that actually participated at the district tournament. Quotas for each district or regional tournament to state competition will be determined as follows:

<u>Complete Teams Competing In District Competition</u>	<u>Teams to State</u>
1-3	1
4-6	2
7-9	3
10-over	4

If only one team participates in a district, the IHSAA should be contacted to determine play-off procedures.

Individuals — Boys & Girls

Individuals may qualify for the State Tournament according to the number of complete teams participating in the district tournament. Example: District - four teams competing, the four lowest scoring individuals qualify for State.

Special Qualifiers — Boys

In District Tournaments on a course rated 68 or more, a 5A or 4A team with a score of 315 or better, and a 3A or 2A team with a score of 325 or better, shall be eligible to send special qualifiers to State.

Special Qualifiers — Girls

A 5A or 4A team may qualify with a team score of 405 or below at the district tournament and 3A or 2A team may qualify with a team score of 425 or below at the district tournament.

Host Team

The team hosting the State Golf Tournament will be allowed to compete in the state tournament if they do not meet the qualifying standards. All other teams competing in the state tournament must meet the qualifying standards.

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP (Boys and Girls)

Each school may enter five players, but the total strokes of four players will determine the team score.

AWARDS

Medalist Honors

All athletes entered in the tournament may play for medalist honors . Medal play is based on the 18 hole scores from the first day. The top four finishers in medalist competition will be awarded medals.

Trophies: Boys & Girls

Trophies will be awarded to the Championship and Runner-up teams. Medals will be awarded to the members of the top four teams.

PRACTICE ROUNDS

There are no practice rounds scheduled for any classification on any golf course. Participants may play the golf course on their own any time prior to the starting time of the state tournament.

STARTING TIMES

All divisions will begin at 8:00 A.M.

ATTIRE

Boys and girls must wear slacks (no denim jeans) or shorts and collared shirts.

RAIN-OUT PLAN

First Day - All participants play 18 holes.

Second Day - If the course is unplayable, scores from the first round will determine team and medalist champions.

RULES

1. USGA Rules of Golf will govern all tournament play, with allowed local course rules.
2. Players are not permitted to play the course, any hole, or to practice putt on a course green the same day as the meet. Practice between rounds is prohibited and penalty for breach of rule is disqualification. During a round, a player shall not play a practice stroke either during the play of a hole or between the play of two holes except that, between the play of two holes, the player may practice putting or chipping on or near any practice putting green or the teeing ground of the next hole to be played in the round, provided such practice stroke is not played from a hazard and does not unduly delay play.

Note: Practice on or near the putting green of the hole last played is prohibited and penalty for breach of rule is two strokes. In the event of a breach between the play of two holes, the penalty applies to the next hole.

Note: A practice swing is not a practice stroke and may be taken at any place, provided the player does not breach the rules.

3. Caddies are not permitted during district and state championship play. (This includes teammates, coaches and parents.)
4. Coaches are permitted to talk to players during the match and between nines, but they are not to advise players about playing a particular hole.
5. Coaches are not permitted to play the course during the hours the state tournament is in progress without permission from the tournament manager.

Special note: There are many rules in the game of golf. Coaches should make an effort to help all participants abide by the rules of golf and the rules set up for district and state play. It is unethical to try to win a championship by disqualification.

6. There shall be no aiding of the competitor at the state golf Tournament. The gallery must be a reasonable distance (at least 25 feet) from the competitors.
7. Any player who continues to disregard the gallery distance rule shall be assessed one penalty stroke for that match.
8. There shall be no use of alcohol, tobacco or drugs by competitors. Anyone found guilty will be immediately and automatically disqualified.
9. Any player who violates the sportsmanship rules of golf will be assessed one penalty stroke for each unsportsmanlike act.
10. Boys and girls must wear slacks (no denim jeans) or golf shorts and a collared shirt.
11. Participants will not be allowed to wear headphones during tournament play.

SCORING

Rule 6-6 shall apply. Players in the foursome will be assigned as markers for another member of the foursome. Player 1 will score for 2, 2 will score for 3, 3 for 4, and 4 will score for 1. After each hole the marker should check the score with the competitor. On completion of the round the marker shall sign the card and hand it to the competitor.

The competitor shall check his score for each hole, settle any doubtful points with the Committee, ensure that the marker has signed the card, countersign the card himself, and return it to the scorer's table as soon as possible. The competitor is responsible for the correctness of the score recorded for each hole. Penalty for breach of Rule 6-6b is disqualification. Coaches should check all of their players' scorecards before players turn the cards in.

INDIVIDUAL SCORECARDS

Many scorecards completed by players are very difficult to read the hole-by-hole scores. During the regular season, coaches should be encouraged to stress the importance of legible and accurate scorecards. Numbers must be written clearly. When a mistake is made in the recording of the hole-by-hole score, the mistake should be crossed out and the correct score written directly below the crossed out incorrect score. The correct score should never be written over the mistake. Before submitting the scorecard to the scoring committee, players must check to insure scores are clearly legible and correct.

TIES AT DISTRICT OR STATE COMPETITION

When a tie occurs at the end of regulation play between 2 or more teams for 1st or 2nd place during tournament play, the tie will be broken by a sudden-death playoff. The following procedures will be followed:

- a. The teams that are tied will play 5 golfers and score the 4 lowest individual scores for both boys and girls. The team with the lowest combined team score will be declared the winner.
- b. If the teams remain tied at the end of the first hole played during sudden-death play, the same procedure will be used for the remaining holes until the tie is broken.
